

Hello MT Families!

The MTPTA is honored to be a part of our Stockings for Soldiers and Adopt A Family programs once again. We partner with local organizations to help those in our community in need. In the month of November, we will be accepting donations for both of these programs. If your family is able to do so, we would greatly appreciate any help you can offer!

From Nov. 2nd-Nov. 13th, there will be a bin in the lobby of the school to collect donations for Stockings for Soldiers. This program supplies an 18-inch stocking full of much-needed supplies to soldiers deployed overseas during the holidays. Currently, they are asking for the following:

- Beef Jerky
- Flip-top fruit containers
- Protein bars
- Protein snacks, such as nuts in individual bags
- Hydration mixes, such as Gatorade, Crystal Light, etc.

They are also happy and grateful to receive a picture or letter your child can color to include in a stocking!! They need between 4,000-15,000!

From Nov. 2nd-Nov. 20th, we will also be collecting items for our Adopt- A- Family program. This program has made the holiday season a happier one for some local families who may be in need this year. Friendly Reminders from the Nurses Office

Sorry if we sound like a broken record, but for us to continue in-school learning, it requires schools and families to work together to continue to limit the spread of transmission of the virus that causes Covid-19. We appreciate all the extra time and effort it takes for these added layers of protection that are necessary to keep our staff and students safe. These include making sure your child has a clean mask each day, being a role model and frequently washing your hands, wearing a mask in public places, physical distancing and performing daily screenings on your child before sending to school.

We will continue to remind everyone that New Hampshire still has a travel advisory in place for all people who travel outside of the New England States (NH, ME, VT, MA, CT or RI) We understand and appreciate that some of you have family that you will be visiting over the upcoming holiday season. Please remember that if you are traveling outside of the New England states, students must remain out of school for 14 days, the first day being the day you return to NH, and self-monitor for Covid-19 symptoms. You cannot “test out” of quarantine. Please reach out to your child’s teacher as well as the office staff and nurses prior to travel, so that we are all aware of the situation and can prepare for your child’s change in schedule.

On another note.... If you keep your child home from school, please let us know the reason for your child’s absence and if they are sick what symptoms they are having. There are many different symptoms of Covid-19 including fever 100.4>, chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, sore throat, headache, vomiting, diarrhea. If your child is home or sent home from school with these symptoms, we advise you to call your health care provider for Covid testing (PCR or antigen). A student may return to school once they have a negative Covid result (note required) or a note from your physician saying symptoms not Covid related and cleared to be in school or if you choose not to test may return after 10 days from symptom onset and until at least 24 hours have passed with no fever and improvement in other symptoms.

Did you know there are so many benefits to beginning a day with thoughts of gratitude? Your child may have talked about how gratitude is when you feel thankful and want to share that feeling with others. They talked about how gratitude can help build positive relationships with their family and friends. How it can help them celebrate small successes and build confidence in their ability to accomplish their bigger goals. Students have been eager to share and write about the things that they are grateful for. In one 2nd grade class, students talked about being grateful for “trees so that we can have books and paper, friends, family, and their teacher.” You may want to have them share what they are grateful for, the people they are grateful for who help them, or have them show you how to take a Gratitude Breath.

In this unprecedented time, we as teachers are truly grateful to be back in school, to have the daily opportunity to connect and teach your children, and as always, your on-going support. Wishing you a day filled with grateful thoughts!
